This bill establishes the 21-member Health Insurance Policy Coalition. The coalition is to develop recommendations for legislative remedies to address the expansion of health care coverage.

The cost for travel reimbursement for the non-state employee members is estimated to be between \$3,000 and \$6,000. Although there is no sunset date on this bill, for purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed the work of the coalition would be completed in FY 08. The expertise exists within the Health and Human Services System to staff this coalition. In recent years information has been gathered regarding the problem of people lacking health care insurance coverage and potential solutions examined. Most recently this work was done as part of the Medicaid Reform effort in this state. The Department of Health and Human Services may need additional operation costs of up to \$10,000 to assist with the work of this commission.
