Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB162 creates the Child Care Safety & Security Fund & the Child Care Safety & Security Act. The act will be administered by the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) so that the standards for emergency preparedness & response for child care & early education programs will be aligned with the same standards as elementary & secondary schools.

NDE will award grants to educational service units (ESUs) on a competitive basis on behalf of designees for emergency response notification systems, training, & materials related to safety & reunification procedures.

ESUs can apply to NDE for a grant to provide funding to designees operating within the boundaries of the ESU. To receive funding, a designee will enter into a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the appropriate ESU in the designee's geographic area for the purpose of funding qualifying projects.

On or before December 1 of each year, NDE will provide an electronic report to the Clerk of the Legislature which will include, but not be limited to:

- the number of designees that received grant funding under the Act, including:
 - the type of organization
 - o the ages of children served by programs enrolled in the emergency response notification system
 - o the number of children served by those programs
 - the geographic locations of those programs
- how the grant funds were used
- the average amount of grant funds received by designees broken down by the number of children served
- the number of designees denied grant funding & the reasons for each of the denials

The report will not identify any child care or early education program in it.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council (ESUCC) estimates the need for an additional FTE at each of the seventeen ESUs. The seventeen FTEs carry a salary & benefits expense of \$85,000 for both FY2025-26 & FY2026-27.

NDE estimates the need for an additional FTE. The FTE carries a salary & benefits expense of \$126,013; operating expenses of \$22,640; & travel expenses of \$10,139 for FY2025-26. For FY2026-27, the FTEs carries a salary & benefits expense of \$129,842; operating expenses of \$18,370; & travel expenses of \$10,443.

The Child Care Safety & Security Fund will consist of money transferred by the Legislature. Funding amounts for designees will not exceed one thousand dollars per year.

Awards will be based off of available appropriations. The bill does not address funding or limitations related to the total cost of the program.

Explanation of Estimate:

In order to provide support in development and carrying out this bill, ESUs will need to apply for grants, manage memoranda of understanding (MOUs) with designees, and submit for reimbursements. The time necessary to complete these responsibilities would vary depending on number of entities wishing to apply, length of time to apply for the dollars, and the number of reimbursement transactions for each. There will be fiscal impact on ESUs for their support staff to take on this additional workload, and a specific number is difficult to predict.

A minimum per ESU to cover personnel costs would be \$5,000 per ESU. This number multiplied by 17 ESUs would be \$85,000.
