LB 108 allows a motor vehicle dealer to apply for a title for an all-terrain vehicle without an identification inspection by a county sheriff, if the dealer has a signed affidavit from an authorized seller stating the vehicle is not stolen and a statement from a county sheriff that the vehicle identification number or a description of the vehicle has been checked in the National Crime Information Center and Nebraska Crime Information Service. The county sheriff is to respond to a request by a dealer for such statement within five days.

The bill does not have a fiscal impact for any state agency. The elimination of a physical inspection of these all-terrain vehicles by a county sheriff may result in a minimal reduction in workload. However, no reduction in expenses is projected.
