LB 798 amends statute regarding cities of the second class and villages.

The bill changes the minimum size of a planning commission for villages and second-class cities to be 3 individuals instead of 5.

The bill creates a process for cities of the second class to change to allow members of its governing body to be elected "at-large" as opposed to "by ward." It provides rules for the makeup of the governing body and terms for those elected.
