Certain changes to the Community College Foundation and Equalization act which, under current law, are to become effective with distribution of aid to community college areas for 2009-10 would be delayed in their implementation until 2011-12 under LB400. Provisions which governed distribution of aid to community college areas for 2008-09 would remain in effect for 2009-10 and 2010-11 under provisions of the bill. The ultimate impact of the bill is dependent upon the level of state aid appropriated for community college areas for the 2009-11 biennium. Summarized in the tables at the following page are estimates of (1) the distribution of aid to community college areas assuming the Appropriations Committee preliminary recommendation for such funding for 2009-10 and 2010-11 under provisions of current law, (2) distribution of community college area aid assuming the Appropriations Committee preliminary recommendation for such funding for 2009-10 and 2010-11 under provisions of LB400, and (3) the difference between the LB400 estimated aid distribution versus the current law estimated aid distribution. It should be noted that although estimates of state aid distribution for 2010-11 are reflected in the tables, multiple factors impacting aid distribution are subject to significant variation. Therefore, estimates of state aid distribution, particularly for 2010-11, are tentative and subject to significant variation from estimates reflected in the tables at the following page.
