This bill would increase liquor taxes and adopt the Citizen Safety Grant Fund Program Act. The bill has the emergency clause. The Citizen Safety Grant Fund is created by this bill. The fund revenues consist of the increase in the alcoholic liquor taxes proposed by this bill: five cents per gallon on beer, three cents per gallon on wine not produced in farm wineries, and seven cents per gallon on spirits.

The program will provide grants to assist eligible organizations in addressing violent crime. Eligible organizations are defined as the Nebraska State Patrol, a county sheriff's department, or a city police department. Grants shall be awarded beginning September 1, 2010. The Crime Commission is to administer this act.

The Liquor Control Commission estimates the increase in the alcoholic liquor taxes as follows:

The Liquor Control Commission notes that this estimate is based on 2008 consumption and assumes consumption will remain constant.

The Crime Commission estimates the following administrative costs associated with this bill:

The Crime Commission states that they would need to add the FTE to administer the program, and the start date is assumed to be May 1, 2010. The Crime Commission's governing board would be used to award the grant funds starting on September 1, 2010.

IMPACT ON POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS: Eligible organizations include a county sheriff's department and a city police department. Such departments would be eligible to receive additional funds to use in addressing violent crime. The amount of this additional funding is not known at this time, but would be some portion of the \$2 million estimated by the Crime Commission in FY2011.

COMMENTS				

CRIME COMMISSION: Depending on the rules and regulations to be promulgated by the Crime Commission, there is some question of whether the grant program would necessitate the administrative costs envisioned.

LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION: The bill increases the rate of tax on beer, wine and spirits and allocates the increased tax revenue to the Citizen Safety Grant Fund rather than to the General Fund. The agency calculations appear reasonable. This would not represent a reduction to General Fund revenues.
