This bill provides definitions for community engagement requirements under the medical assistance program. The bill defines "extended period of time," "inpatient hospital services," "outside of the individual's community," and "serious or complex medical condition." The Department of Health and Human Services indicates these definitions as drafted are broader than the current draft policy. This would result in more individuals receiving exemptions from community engagement and reduced savings. The fiscal impact is indeterminable.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB1221 provides four definitions for the Medicaid program to adopt regarding short-term hardship events under the new Medicaid work requirements for individuals eligible for Medicaid in the adult expansion group. Medicaid work requirements in Nebraska are currently being developed and are scheduled to begin on May 1, 2026. Approval from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will be required through a State Plan Amendment (SPA) related to work requirements.

The four definitions provided in this bill are:

- extended period of time.
- inpatient hospital services.
- outside of the individual's community.
- serious or complex medical condition.

These definitions are more specific than the current draft policy but do not conflict with draft regulatory language prepared for Title 477, Nebraska Administrative Code (NAC) 29, or the State Plan. If the short-term hardship definitions are adopted as written, more beneficiaries may qualify for hardship exemptions and therefore may not be required to meet Medicaid work requirements during their renewal period. Medicaid work requirements were passed into federal law in order to reduce overall Medicaid spending. This bill would minimize the reduction related to work requirements, but the exact fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
