LB 421 changes provisions relating to the number of sets of Purple Heart license plates that may be issued to an individual. Currently, individuals may apply for Purple Heart plates for only one motor vehicle or trailer. The bill provides for any number of motor vehicles or trailers owned by an applicant to have the plates.

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) indicates 921 sets of Purple Heart plates were issued in 2006. It is unknown how many vehicles are owned by individuals eligible for Purple Heart plates. This fiscal note assumes the number of Purple Heart plates currently issued may double pursuant to LB 421. Applicants for plates pay the regular license plate fee and an additional $\$ 5$ fee for the specialty plates. The $\$ 5$ fee is placed in the Highway Trust Fund. Increased revenue for the Highway Trust Fund is projected to be less than $\$ 4,600$ pursuant to the bill. It is assumed DMV can handle any increased need for Purple Heart plates with existing appropriations for license plate production.
