LB 338 pertains to weed control ordinances enacted by first and second class cities and villages.

Currently, these cities and villages can require owners and occupants of property to keep weeds and grasses shorter than 12 inches tall. Noncompliance is a Class V misdemeanor and owners can be required to pay for the cost of mowing. LB 338 lowers the allowed growth height to 6 inches.

It would appear that cities and villages could continue to use a 12 inch height standard if they wish, but LB 338 would grant them the authority to reduce this height limitation to 6 inches. Any fiscal impact for those cities and villages reducing the height requirement is expected to be minimal.

The City of Imperial has estimated a potential increase in costs of \$1,000-\$1,200 annually to serve notices of violations to owners and occupants more frequently.
