LB 261 pertains to the compilation, storing, preserving, trading, selling or sharing of encoded information from a person's driver's license or state identification card by a retailer. The bill provides that retailers or programmers for retailers may be convicted of a Class IV felony for certain violations in the collection, maintenance or use of information from operator's licenses and identification cards.

It is assumed there will be very few individuals convicted of felonies pursuant to the bill. It is possible there could be a very minimal impact on the prison and/or jail population because there could be an increase in persons prosecuted and convicted. If convicted persons are assessed a fine, there will be an increase in revenue for the respective counties which shall accrue to the public schools. Any fiscal impact is indeterminable, but projected to be minimal.
