LB 368 provides that persons driving a motor vehicle at a speed greater than 100 miles per hour are guilty of willful reckless driving. The bill requires jail sentences for persons guilty of such offenses. The jail term ranges from one to thirty days depending upon the number of convictions and the miles per hour driven in excess of 100.

The bill has no fiscal impact for the state. However, the requirement for jail sentences to be imposed for persons driving in excess of 100 miles per hour will increase the number of persons incarcerated which will have an unknown fiscal impact for political subdivisions.
