Probation Administration notes that the impact was calculated as follows:

Probation Administration states that the Work Ethic Camp (WEC) is primarily operated by two Intensive Supervision Probation officers (ISP), but that four other ISP officers in the region need to be trained for duties at the WEC as needed. The Legislative Fiscal Office analyst (LFO) understands that the Department of Correctional Services (DCS) currently provides training for its employees at WEC. It appears that Probation Administration could have its employees trained through the training currently offered by DCS. Therefore, it appears to LFO that there will be no additional costs incurred by Probation Administration.

The Board of Parole estimates no fiscal impact.

The Department of Correctional Services (DCS) notes that the bill would change current statutes to allow offenders sentenced to DCS institutions to be placed at the WEC. Currently, the WEC houses probationers sentenced by the Courts as a form of intensive supervision probation. DCS notes that the average daily population at the WEC is approximately 70. The facility was built to house 100, and could easily house up to 120 offenders.

The DCS notes that placement of 'pre-parole' inmates at the WEC would increase the costs of operating the facility. However, it is not anticipated that additional significant costs would be incurred because inmate per-diem would transfer with the offender. Any one-time costs incurred in making this change would be absorbed by DCS.
