LB 490 would eliminate the current nonresident annual hunting permit (\$80 fee) and the nonresident 2-day hunting permit (\$35 fee) and in their place establish a single 10-day nonresident permit (assumed \$80 fee).

The Game and Parks Commission assumes that the number of nonresident 10-day permits sold will equal the number of annual permits currently sold (15,000 permits). The revenue loss identified by the Commission comes from the elimination of 2-day permit sales. Under this scenario the hunting permit revenue loss would be approximately \$60,000 annually.

In regards to impact on habitat stamp sales, the Commission assumes that some of the individuals who drop out of purchasing the nonresident permit will in fact purchase a habitat stamp to go big game hunting. This offset lowers the negative impact on the sale of habitat stamps to an estimated 940 fewer stamps sold. This equates to a revenue loss of \$15,000 annually.

There is no basis to disagree with these assumptions, and therefore there is no basis to disagree with the Commission's estimated revenue loss of \$75,000 annually. The actual impact on revenues will depend on decisions made by each individual on whether the new 10-day nonresident permit fits their situation.

Technical note: If the revenue loss affects FY09-10 as indicated by the Commission, the change in fees would have to occur prior to the fall 2009 hunting season.
