LB 478 provides for the issuance of liquor licenses for retail alcohol sales on lands owned by the Game and Parks Commission, and provides that the consumption of alcoholic liquor on such lands shall not be prohibited.

The Game and Parks Commission currently has concessionaires that sell alcohol on state recreation areas. The language in the bill related to liquor licenses does not appear to impact current operations and accordingly will not have a fiscal impact.

The provisions contained in section 2 (3), regarding consumption of alcohol, could be interpreted to mean that the Game and Parks Commission could not prohibit or regulate the consumption of alcoholic beverages on lands they own or operate. In this situation, as Game and Parks mentions in their fiscal note, there could be an increase in alcohol related disturbances, vandalism and trash. Whether this translates into increased labor (overtime) and/or maintenance costs is unknown as these acts are purely speculative at this time.
