LB 690 creates an apprentice hunter education exemption certificate which will allow an individual 29 years of age or younger to hunt, under the conditions outlined in the bill, without having passed a hunter education course. The cost of the certificate is \$5, and it can be renewed one time (it is anticipated a \$1 issuance fee will also be charged). The bill also lowers the minimum age to hunt deer from 12 to 10, and eliminates the requirement to have passed a hunter education course for individuals older than 29. Provisions of the bill that remove the minimum age to hunt wild turkey will not have a fiscal impact since this change was included in LB299 passed last session.

The impact on cash fund revenues as estimated by the Game and Parks Commission are summarized as follows. Please see their attached response for greater detail on assumptions made in developing these estimates. Implementation costs are expected to be minimal.
