LB 391 changes provisions related to public requests to examine and receive copies of public records. Under the bill's provisions, broad requests for records created within a certain time frame would have to include a specific subject matter.

Section 2 clarifies that members of the public may speak on agenda items that appear before public bodies.

Section 3 amends section 84-1412 to clarify that each public body shall have a form on which citizens may recommend subjects as possible agenda items at future meetings.

The provisions of LB 391 do not appear to impose any negative fiscal impact. To the extent that broad requests are curtailed, there may be a cost avoidance. Such cost avoidances cannot be determined due to the speculative nature of these requests. However, this impact is not anticipated to be significant.
