This bill creates the Pharmacy Technician Act. It defines what a pharmacy technician is and what a technician is allowed to do. The Department of Health and Human Services Regulation and Licensure is required to develop and maintain a pharmacy technician registry. Pharmacy technicians are required to register with the state and pay a biennial fee, not to exceed \$50.

The department estimates that approximately 5,000 technicians would register. The regulation of pharmacy technicians would require four additional FTEs: one licensure coordinator, one licensing specialist, one staff assistant and one investigator. The cost will be \$202,120 in FY 08 and \$169,667 in FY 09. Fees would be set at a level to cover costs.
