This bill would name, change, and adopt provisions for the Community Service Sentencing Act. It would change probation administrative sanctions, community service sentencing, and minors with alcohol-related criminal provisions and exempt community service offenders and probationers from workers' compensation coverage.

The Department of Motor Vehicles, the Department of Correctional Services and the Workers Compensation Court estimate no fiscal impact.

The Supreme Court estimates no significant fiscal impact and states the following:

LB 868 creates a requirement for chief probation officers to approve community service projects for offenders. Such approval is to be given based on information provided by community service programs on a written form. It is assumed that this form will be created and provided by the Office of Probation Administration. The fiscal impact of this requirement is not estimated to be significant.
