This bill would change certain provisions relating to assault, criminal attempt, weapons, arrests, bail, custody, discovery, and juveniles.

The provisions of this bill could impact criminal justice resources (law enforcement, prosecutors, public defenders, jails, prisons). It is unknown how many individuals would violate the provisions of this bill, and therefore, it will have an indeterminate impact on criminal justice expenditures.

The State Patrol estimates no fiscal impact.

The Department of Correctional Services (DCS) estimates a minimal impact. Their response follows:

LB771, adds certain DHHS employees as 'officers' in the offense of 'assault on an officer'.
 The bill adds employees of DHHS who work in a youth rehabilitation center or treatment facility as defined in 71-914.
 It is unknown how many individuals would be convicted of this offense, but the impact to DCS would be minimal.

Other portions of the bill address aspects of juveniles in custody, and would not impact the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services.
