This bill would change Nebraska Workers' Compensation Act provisions governing disability compensation after retirement.

The Workers Compensation Court states that this bill would almost certainly result in increased litigation and a corresponding increase in the workload of the judges and staff of the court. Over time the cumulative effect of bills which increase the workload of the court may result in the need for an additional judge and support staff. However, the court is unable to quantify the additional workload which would result from this bill alone, and therefore they are unable to identify any fiscal impact for the court due to the bill by itself.
