LB 768 provides procedures to be followed to terminate a township board. If a township board has become inactive, as defined in the bill, the county board shall hold a public hearing on the issue of termination. If no appointments to the township board have been made within thirty days after the hearing the county board may adopt a resolution to terminate the township board on the following June 30th. The bill goes on to provide the process to be followed to handle the unfinished business of the terminated township board.

LB 768 will not have a fiscal impact until the situation arises that a township board has become inactive. In which case the county may incur workload and possibly cost increases associated with the required public hearing and other assigned duties; any related fiscal impact in is expected to be minor.
