LB 768 provides procedures to be followed to terminate a township board. If a township board has become inactive, as defined in the bill, the county board shall hold a public hearing on the issue of termination. If no appointments to the township board have been made within thirty days after the hearing the county board may adopt a resolution to terminate the township board on the following June 30<sup>th</sup>. The bill goes on to provide the process to be followed to handle the unfinished business of the terminated township board.

LB 768 will not have a fiscal impact until the situation arises that a township board has become inactive. In which case the county may incur workload and possibly cost increases associated with the required public hearing and other assigned duties; any related fiscal impact in is expected to be minor.
