This bill would change provisions relating to shoplifting and prohibit possession of any store security device countermeasure. A security device countermeasure is a coated bag capable of shielding goods from detection by an electronic theft alarm sensor, or a device which bypasses an electronic theft alarm sensor. It is a Class II misdemeanor to possess a security device countermeasure.

The provisions of this bill could impact criminal justice resources (law enforcement, prosecutors, public defenders, jails, prisons). It is unknown how many individuals would violate the provisions of this bill, and therefore, it will have an indeterminate impact on criminal justice expenditures.
