LB913 creates the Criminal Offender Employment Act in order to give criminal offenders or ex-convicts the opportunity to secure employment or to engage in a lawful trade, occupation, or profession.

The provisions in LB913 with regard to employment appear to have no significant fiscal impact.

The provisions in LB913 with regard to licensure or certification will probably at a minimum require the rewriting of rules and regulations for state agencies and political subdivisions. Rewriting rules and regulations will increase costs. The Department of Education estimates the cost associated with rewriting rules and regulations and revising forms to be \$7,445.

The Department of Administrative Services indicates minimal (\$957) one-time costs to change the current job application form.

Per e-mail correspondence, the State Patrol has indicated an increase in cost because records would have to be sanitized prior to dissemination. The State Patrol has indicated that this would increase the amount of processing time needed, as well as increased man hours to accomplish the task. The Patrol is estimating an additional 1 manpower hour for each request. In 2009 there were 21,267 requests. The impact in labor is estimated at \$255,204. There is no basis to disagree with the estimate.
