This bill would change workers' compensation provisions relating to claims for legal services or disbursements.

The Workers Compensation Court states that the bill appears to remove a restriction on the circumstances under which an enforceable lien could be granted by the court. As such, the bill could result in an increase in the number of filings requesting such a lien, and a corresponding increase in workload for the court's judges and staff. However, at this time the court does not anticipate that the additional workload would require an increase in staffing or related expenditures.
