SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. The call is raised. For the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I have a series of items. Mr. President, I have a Reference Report referring LB 1243 to the Judiciary Committee. That is signed by Senator Labedz as Chair of Reference. A hearing notice from Banking, Commerce, and Insurance, Mr. President, for February 20, signed by Senator Landis.

Amendments to be printed to LB 1022 by Senator Smith; Senators Warner and Beyer to LB 369. (See pages 744-46 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, your Committee on Transportation whose Chair is Senator Lamb reports LB 1186 to General File with committee amendments attached, signed by Senator Lamb. Banking Committee reports LB 93 as indefinitely postponed, LB 100, LB 454, LB 461, LB 529, LB 560, LB 578, LB 593, LB 647, LB 771, LB 1008, LB 1027, LB 1045, LB 1078, LB 1110, and LB 1123, all reported indefinitely postponed, those signed by Senator Landis as Chair of the committee. Government Committee, Mr. President, whose Chair is Senator Baack, reports LB 1019 to General File, LB 517 indefinitely postponed, LB 1048, LB 1081, and LR 13CA as indefinitely postponed, those signed by Senator Baack as Chair. (See pages 746-47 of the Legislative Journal.)

New A bills, Mr. President, LB 1010A by Senators Ashford, McFarland, and Chambers; LB 1085A by Senator Wesely; LB 1064A by Senator Wesely. (All read for the first time by title. See page 748 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Mr. Clerk, moving on to the next bill on General File, LB 1199.

CLERK: LB 1199, Mr. President, was a bill introduced by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18 of this year, referred to the Banking, Commerce, and Insurance Committee for public hearing. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. (Gavel.) The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

CLERK: Mr. President, 1004A by Senator Rogers. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Rogers, please.

SENATOR ROGERS: Mr. President, speakers, you've all got a fiscal note, I mean, rather than me trying to read where all this money is going, I mean, I'll just give some of the classification titles of some of the people that the Department of Ag will have to hire. There's an accounting clerk, about three ag inspection specialists in the veterinary field office, and an attorney and an office clerk and a staff assistant. The total A bill is 866,000 for '90-91 and 928,000 for '91-92. Then on the back of the sheet I wish that if some of you would care to, you'd look at that. It gives some of the costs that the producers will bear. Vaccine costs are like 421,000 a year, one herd testing is 1,400,000, feeder pig producers is 265,000, farrow to finish 800,000, seed stock producer inspection, this is money that is in the lost column, you might say, if you looked at it as a producer but, in other words, the producers are funding 4 or \$5 million of this particular bill over a two-year period and I'd ask for its advancement.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, please. Okay, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. I still need a little help. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1004A.

PRESIDENT: LB 1004A advances. LB 1064A.

CLERK: 1064A, Mr. President, offered by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, LB 1064A is that clean-up bill for the Health Department and at this time deals with primarily x-ray regulation. There are fees charged on x-ray operators that cover the cost of administering the program. The A bill is cash funds from those fees. It's about \$143,000, but all that is paid for from the fees that are collected from this program, so I'd move the advancement of the

bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. I need a little help again, please. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1064A.

PRESIDENT: LB 1064A advances. We'll move back up to LB 902, please. Senator Hall, you're back.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 902A was a bill introduced by Senator Hall. (Read title.)

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members, 902A is approximately \$4,500 out of the General Fund in '90-91, \$1,000 in '91-92. This bill piggybacks with 902 which was a bill that dealt with the hearing impaired symbols. We, as you remember, the other day passed over it. It was on consent calendar. I had filed a kill motion on it because I had not yet had time to talk to the folks in the hearing impaired community. I would ask you to advance it so that it is at the same stage of debate with 902. The kill motion is on there. I have no intention of moving the bill should I not be able to come to consensus with the folks in the hearing impaired community. I would urge the advancement.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Need a little help, please. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President on the advancement of 902A.

PRESIDENT: LB 902A is advanced. Anything for the good of the cause, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 852 and find the same correctly engrossed, LB 872, LB 1022, LB 1043, LB 1044, LB 1063, LB 1070, LB 1076 and LB 1098, all of those reported correctly engrossed. (See page 821 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 958 pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1980 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 1 nay, 5 present and not voting, 12 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 958 passes. LB 1064E.

CLERK: (Read LB 1064 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure. having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1064 with the emergency clause attached pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1981 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 36 ayes, 0 mays, 1 present and not voting, 12 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 1064E passes. And while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business I propose to sign and I do sign, LB 571A, LB 571, LB 1241, LB 1244, LB 220, LB 220A, and LB 843. Mr. Clerk, would you read LB 1064A.
