I will talk about the amendment in just a minute which will change that date. But the main purpose of the bill is to make the inventory coincide with the fiscal year and, therefore, the inventory will be more in line and more representative of the state's assets at the end of the fiscal year. The amendment, the bill reads that they will...the inventory reporting date is the 31st of July. The committee amendment would say that we would move that to the 31st of August, and that was done at the request of the agencies who said the 31st of July might be a little soon for them to get their report in, so we gave them an extra month. Now if there is questions, I will be glad to answer them. If not, I'd just move the advancement of the amendment or the adoption of the amendment.
