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SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members. I am introducing this resolution today that will acknowledge the dedicated service and knowledge and expertise of Mr. Phil Kruse. He has worked as a consultant on the 309 Task Force Building Maintenance Committee, and has been a long-time contributor to the State of Nebraska. He began his career in the state in 1934 over at UN-L shoveling coal. Phil now has reached the age of 80 and is starting his fifty-second year of service to the State of Nebraska. The Building Maintenance Committee feels very few people have attained his accomplishments, especially with the dedication he has provided over the years to the State of Nebraska and the 309 Task Force. We feel that Phil deserves this sincere recognition and I urge your consideration of the passage of this resolution.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion on the adoption of LR 252. There are no lights. Senator Conway, anything further? Thank you. The question is the adoption of LR 252. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 252.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The resolution is adopted. LR 253, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 253 found on page 722 of the Journal asks the Legislature to proclaim the week of February 11 through the 17th as Vocational Education Week.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The Chair recognizes Senator Owen Elmer, please.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I have an unusual honor this morning in order to introduce the resolution for our honorable speaker since he is in the Chair and can't do it for himself. This resolution would establish February 11th through the 17th as Vocational Education Week, and honors individuals that help themselves reach new goals for themselves and ultimately for society, and these organizations that they are members of are such as FFA, FHA-HERO, FBLA, HOSA, AIASA, PBL, DECA, and VICA. The American Vocational Association has

established the second week in February as Vocational Education Week and is supported by the Nebraska Vocational Association. This resolution proclaims the week of February 11th through the 17th, 1990 as Vocational Education Week, and is the same type of resolution that we have passed many times over the years in the past. I would ask your support for LR 253 and our Speaker, Senator Barrett.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, sir. Any discussion on the adoption of LR 253? Seeing none, those in favor of the adoption of the resolution please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

The bill was introduced on January 11 of last year, Mr. President, at that time referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have....I have no committee amendments pending. I do have other amendments. Senator, you want to offer your amendment, first, or go to the bill?

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hall to open on the bill. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members. LB 346, as the Clerk told you, is a bill that was introduced last year and chose it as my priority bill this year. It is a bill that deals with tuition tax deductions. That is a far cry from a tuition tax credit, which is a form of this bill, had taken prior to the change in our income tax system, prior to 1987. The bill, as you can see from the handout that you all have on your desk, the cream-colored sheet, gives you a run down on the provisions in it, how it would apply, to whom it would apply, and deal with some of the concerns and the issues that opponents have raised with regard to it. The bill would allow for expenses that an individual incurred for education of children that fall from K to 12th grade to be deducted from one's income This is applicable to anyone who has children either in a
