PRESIDENT: We'll move on to the revisor's bills then, under number eight.

CLERK: Mr. President, revisor bills, series of revisor bills this morning. The first is LB 1. It's a bill offered by Senator Labedz, as Chairperson of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5, Mr. President, referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labedz, please.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. Before I start on the 17 bills, the revisor bills, I want to remind the senators to avoid the temptation to amend these bills, which are bills designed to correct errors made in prior years, and bills which

would remove obsolete language in references to laws which are no longer in effect. There are 17 of these bills which will be considered today. I'll make my explanations as brief as possible, but some explanation is absolutely necessary. I would bring to your attention a packet of information provided to me by the Revisor of Statutes, Joanne Pepperl, which explains each bill in detail. There should be one on your desk. If you want, you can follow along with me during the explanation, although I would appreciate your attention in giving me a vote as we go through these bills. We're not unduly dela...so we won't be unduly delayed this morning. LB 1. This bill repeals three sections dealing with the Liquor Control Commission, which are obsolete. I urge you to advance this bill to E & R Initial. That's it, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right. Any further comment? You've heard the motion to advance on LB 1. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1.

PRESIDENT: LB 1 advances. LB 2.
