SPEAKER BAPRETT: Additional bill introductions, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 99-150 by title for the first time. See pages 67-76 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all I have at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: More bill introductions, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 151-160 by title for the first time. See pages 76-79 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, in addition to those new bills I have new resolutions. (Read LR 1-2 for the first time. See pages 79-81 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, in addition to those items I have a series of announcements. Mr. President, there will be a meeting of the Executive Board today at three-fifteen for purposes of referencing. Executive Board, three-fifteen for referencing.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The question before the body is one of adjournment. Those in favor of adjourning please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. Back to discussion on the advancement of the bill. Senator Baack.

SENATOR BAACK: Are there others lights after mine?

SPEAKER BARRETT: I'm sorry, yes, there are. Senator Baack, I'm sorry, I overlooked one light. Senator Withem's light has been on.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I was going to call the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Schmit, please, followed by Senator Wesely. Senator Wesely. Did you wish to close, Senator Warner? Okay, the question is the adoption of the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, O nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Warner amendment is adopted.

Mr. President, Senator Moore would move to amend the bill. (The Moore amendment appears on page 2257 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore, please.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President and members, if you look at page 2257 of the Journal, you will see this amendment, it's printed. And, quite simply, what this amendment is, this is an amendment that's a "catch a mother napping amendment" and I am going to withdraw it but I'm going to use it to speak on the issue. What this amendment is it relates to LB 105, a bill that I have introduced for a couple of years now dealing with certain items that a certain insurance company in the state, Blue Cross-Blue Shield, refuses to cover. There was legislation passed in the seventies or sixties by then Senator Harold Simpson that required insurance companies to cover all forms of ailments. For a variety of methods, Blue Cross-Blue Shield has used different definitions to, at least in my own opinion, at least, to circumvent the intent of the law and not cover chiropractic payments. I have had trouble with this bill. I have introduced it twice and I've never been able to get it out of committee for a variety of reasons. If I was...had less scruples than some people, I guess I'd just say this is a "trust me" amendment and try and adopt it this morning, but for my own credibility's sake I will not do that. And...but I will allow, I think, some...a couple of people wanted to say a few things, I will allow a couple of people to say a few things before I withdraw it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.
