PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: (Microphone not activated) ...pastor at UN-L, and now is pastoral associate at Trinity Lutheran Church here in Lincoln. Would you please rise for the invocation.

DR. NORDEN: (Prayer offered.)

PRESIDENT: Dr. Norden, thank you for being with us again, we appreciate it. Come back again. Roll call, please. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Do you have any messages, reports or announcements this morning?

CLERK: Mr. President, Reference Report referring LBs 1102-1135, as well as three gubernatorial appointments to the appropriate standing committees for hearing. (See pages 348-49 of the Legislative Journal.)

Received a report from the Department of Roads filed pursuant to statute, Mr. President. That's all that I have.

PRESIDENT: Would you like to introduce any new bills, or would you not like to?

CLERK: Mr. President, I'm sorry, I do have some other items. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 821 and recommend that same be placed on Select File; LB 822, LB 823, LB 824, LB 825, LB 826, LB 827, LB 828, and LB 829, all on Select File, some of which have E & R amendments attached, Mr. President. Now, that's all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 350-51 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: New bills, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills. (Read LBs 1158-1161 by title for the first time. See page 352 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We'll move on to General File then, LB 163.

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LB 161, 1136-1171, 1181-1194

Mr. President, finally, I have a reference report referring LBs 1136-1171. (See pages 373-74 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Do we have some new bills, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills: (Read LBs 1181-1194 by title for the first time. See pages 374-77 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We'll move on to General File, LB 161, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 161 was a bill that was originally introduced by Senators Rod Johnson, Scofield, Coordsen, Baack, Weihing, Schellpeper and Elmer. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 5 of last year, Mr. President. It was referred to the Agriculture Committee for public hearing. The bill was brought to the floor with committee amendments attached. It was considered on April 5, Mr. President. At that time Senator Johnson made a motion to bracket the bill until January 1 of this year. I have pending the committee amendments. They have not been adopted yet, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President and members, the committee amendments are relatively straightforward. It is simple but I would like to share them with you and indicate that hopefully they are noncontroversial. There are four parts to the committee amendment. The first requires the Department of Agriculture to use other agencies when enforcement is necessary in the question of water quality. The Department of Agriculture is the lead agency in implementing this bill, but in many cases we have expertise, especially with water quality and other areas including the Department of Environmental Control, through their work; the Department of Health for the Safe Drinking Water Act and the State Resources Office and there is just a variety of different agencies that I think the department could turn to for assistance and I think the important thing is to make sure that

and nonsmokers have a right to resent it." I do hope that this resolution will receive all of the votes present on the floor, Senator Goodrich said he will not vote for it, so I'll say, with the exception of the one who has expressed opposition to what the resolution attempts to do.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You've heard the closing. And the question is the adoption of LR 257. All in favor of that motion please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 257.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LR 257 is adopted. The Chair is pleased to note that Senator Wehrbein has 15 guests in our south balcony from Elmwood High School. Fifteen seniors are visiting with us this morning along with their teacher. Would you people please stand and be welcomed by your Legislature. Thank you. We're pleased to have you with us. Proceeding to the record, Mr. Clerk. Have you anything to read in?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do. Thank you. Some amendments to be printed to LB 708 by Senator Chambers. Enrollment and Review reports LB 1090, LB 1032, LB 1236, LB 164A, LB 313A, and LB 980A to Select File some of which have E & R amendments attached. General Affairs Committee, whose Chair is Senator Smith, reports LR 241CA to General File; LB 736, indefinitely postponed; LB 1100, indefinitely postponed; LB 1159, indefinitely postponed, those signed by Senator Smith. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 979-80 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Item 6, Mr. Clerk, LB 260 on General File.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 260 was a bill introduced by Senators Conway, Baack and Schmit. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9, last year, Mr. President, at that time referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Revenue Committee, Mr. President. (Standing Committee amendments are on page 724 of the Legislative Journal for the First Session, 1989.)
