SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You have heard the motion to

does allow the farm plated trucks to pull boats or cabin trailers. And also in this amendment is LB 131 by Senator Peterson. It amends the term "motor vehicle" to exclude from the meaning of that term a power unit hay grinder or a combination which includes a power unit and a hay grinder when operated without cargo. This is merely a clarification so that the law enforcement people know that these hay grinder vehicles are exempt from registration. Most of the counties are assuming that is the way it is but some of the counties have questions and this is a clarification to be sure that all of them are treated equally. That, Mr. Chairman, is the contents of amendment 2221, which is in your bill book. And I will have a minor little bill drafting correction for that amendment once the amendment is adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: An amendment on the desk, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend his own amendment. It's found on page 500.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Yes. On page 13, line 16, in the amendment I offered, after "vehicles" insert "enroute to pick up, delivering". It's just a clarification of that part of the amendment which has to do with, I believe it's those hay trucks that return empty that there is a slight drafting area. And I would move that this amendment to the amendment be adopted.
