SENATOR HABERMAN: Would you like to read the amendment, Mr. Clerk?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, the bill, LB 189, said, in essence, the chairperson and members shall be chosen in the same manner as chairpersons and members of the standing committees of the Legislature. It's almost a redundant bill but I took it out of courtesy to the Game and Parks Commission. I would be glad to answer any questions and if not, I would assume that the bill could be moved forward.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members, I would have one question for Senator Schmit if he would yield.
