Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk has presented to the Governor bills read on Final Reading this morning as of 10:00 a.m. (Re: LB 342, LB 114, LB 221.)

A new A bill, LB 183A by Senator Baack. (Read for the first time by title.) A new resolution, LR 37 by Senator Korshoj. (Read brief explanation.) That will be laid over, Mr. President. (See pages 857-58 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Mr. Clerk, proceed to General File, LB 357.

CLERK: LB 357, Mr. President, introduced by Senators Nelson, Smith, Schellpeper, Coordsen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 11, referred to the Education Committee. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. The Legislature on February 8 considered the bill. At that time committee amendments were adopted. There was an amendment to the bill by Senator Nelson. That was adopted. Mr. President, Senator Withem then bracketed the motion until February 22. I do have amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Nelson, I wonder if perhaps we could go to you first for a very short refresher on the bill to bring us up to speed. Would you do that, please?

SENATOR NELSON: Thank you. I would be pleased to do so. As it was noted, LB 357 was bracketed when it was brought to us about a week ago, and we finally, I guess, got to it today. There were two main concerns. Actually, first, I will start and tell

trying to work out details, trying to work out the mechanisms to make this thing work. We have two more years in which to do that and I am more than willing to make any changes that are necessary to do to make it work. What we have here is an opportunity to vote on something that is going to make education accountable in this state. We have that opportunity today. I think we should vote to advance this bill, then I'm willing to work on it between General and Select and try and address Senator Warner's concerns, some of these other concerns that we have with the bill. I'll continue to work with it, but for today I would just encourage you to advance this bill from General File to Select. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question before the body is the advancement of LB 183 to E & R Initial. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. On the advancement of the bill, have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 906-07 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 183.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The bill is advanced. There is an A bill, ladies and gentlemen. Is it possible that we could handle the A bill before we adjourn for lunch?(LB 183A)

SENATOR BAACK: We can do anything you want, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR BAACK: The A bill for this, I think it's \$70,000 and what it is, is the Department of Education has said that they will need some money to deal with the appeals. They have no idea how many there will be, but they are basing that on kind of the same costs that they do for the freeholder petition appeals, so that's all that it is for, \$70,000.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? Seeing none, those in favor of the advancement of LB 183A vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, I will. LB...the committee amendments to LB 183 basically do two things, they first of all reduce the A bill to reflect the various amendments put on 183. Originally the A bill was drafted to... assuming that 183 was going to go into effect immediately and assuming the state department would be spending some money on appeals, that obviously isn't going to be happening, so that money is not needed. Another fund...another fee was going to be used to administer the pool, state money pool that was going to be collected to pay for it. Again, there is a Select File amendment to delete that, so we're saving considerable money with the A bill. We are also, I should point out, with this amendment appropriating \$25,000 to the Legislative Council to carry out the study that Senator Schellpeper's bill requires the Education Committee to make. It's felt that this needs to be a genuine study, we do need to get out into the state where there will be some expenses. We may be bringing in some people that have had experience with a choice bill in other states. So we feel that that is worthwhile. But even with appropriating that additional money, this is about a \$40,000 reduction in the overall expenses of LB 183. I would urge you to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion on the Withem amendment? If not, the question is the adoption of the amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the Withem amendment. Record, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Withem's amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted.
