It just, as I stated, sunsets the provision more than a year after the federal law requiring that the warning be placed on all containers. It also places the E clause on the bill, because I think that it is an important issue. I never denied that. I just think that we were going about it in the wrong way, the body clearly feels otherwise. With that, I think that we should address the issue now and then allow that the requirement for the sign go away, basically 14 months after the federal government law takes effect. I would urge the adoption of the amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.
