It just makes things more easy to operate when you have adjoining cities or close by communities. Now each member of the board shall have to give bond, however, there is some new language there and that is the cost of which may be paid by such city or village which would certainly be an advantage to each board member. There is some language that was struck, it is archaic. In 1976 when it was required to have such a board, then it was necessary to have language as to staggered terms. It is no longer necessary to have that language within the statutes and so it was an opportunity to just simply clean up the language in the I do hope that you look upon this favorably and advance it because it can mean efficiency and maybe less costly where municipalities are close by.
