SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Jacklyn Smith, please.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. This bill was brought as a result of some conflict in, I guess, the interpretation by some county attorneys across the state as to whether or not the law was very clear regarding the timely submission of payment of taxes delinquent on what's due to the counties and the submission of reports, claims and so on to the state or to the county. LB 66 then just clarifies that the date for filing any official government report, claim, tax return, statement or payment connected with either...any of these things, if it should fall on a Saturday, a Sunday or a holiday, would be considered timely if it were postmarked or, if in person...the person came in and paid those taxes or submitted that report. That is simply what the bill does and I would ask for your support in the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? Any questions? If not, those in favor of the advancement of LB 66 to E & R Initial please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, O nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 66.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 66 is advanced. LB 546, Mr. Clerk.

Mr. President, LB 546 was a bill introduced by the Government Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to Government, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Chairman Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members, this is a very simple bill. All it does is we have existing statutory language right now that requires the State Treasurer, in cases in which

any kind of a refund must be paid, the State Treasurer has to sign off on the...sign off and certify that he or she has received the money in question. That is the process right now. What this bill does is it says that the Director of DAS would be authorized to issue the refund warrants directly, without the treasurer's certification. And the State Treasurer's office in and testified for this bill because they said they have no knowledge of the monies that came in anyway. just...it's just simply a clerical function where they have to bring that over to them, they have to sign off on it and certify it, but they have no knowledge that the money...about the monies or the refunds as it comes in. So they simply have to sign off This way...this does not eliminate any checks because there is not a check involved in this process, because the treasurer is not knowledgeable on that issue anyway. They just simply have to sign the form. This would say that DAS, who does have knowledge of the refunds, would be the person that authorizes the refund. With that, I would just urge advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? Any questions? Seeing none, those in favor of the advancement of 547 (sic) to E & R Initial please vote aye, opposed nay. Shall LB 546 be advanced? Please record.
