My guess is for everyone of those, you have got two or three bills that are suggested to you that you say I don't think it will work or I would rather not carry that. Best of luck, maybe you have got another avenue, but, in fact, we can't take that... I am not going to take that problem on. Maybe we don't do it enough but we do it. But imagine a Legislature in which any person in the State of Nebraska could provide us a bill idea that we would have to draft into bill form, hold a public hearing on, have a debate on this floor, and then write our decisions as a body, not just our own individual

emergencies, there could only be 15 people called in, it could only last for 15 days. This has caused some problems in the National Guard in emergency situations. Instead of having that in statute it would say that the Adjutant General would have the discretion to call up as many as were needed for the emergency and allow them to stay on duty as long as was necessary. Another provision in the bill that it changes is right now it says that they can be called in for advice and counsel. and counsel usually consists of ceremonial things in nature, such as funerals, carrying of the colors, these kind of things. Under the present...under present statute it says that they have to be put into a pay classification and should be paid for these duties. What happens is that most of the people that do these duties for the National Guard are already in a for-pay status through their status as regular employees of the National Guard. This would allow the Adjutant General to not have to pay them for these ceremonial duties that he asked them to do. that's basically what the bill does. If there are any questions, I'd be glad to answer them, if not, I would just urge the advancement of the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

Game and Parks has signed off on this. They don't have any objections to it. I would ask that the bill be advanced.
