SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't mind.

PRESIDENT: Thank you for being so cooperative. We'll take it up after lunch. Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Mr. President, I move that we recess until one-thirty.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. We are recessed until one-thirty. Senator Chambers, we'll take yours up...Senator Chambers, we'll take yours up right after...at one-thirty. Okay.

RECESS

PRESIDENT NICHOL PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Members of the Legislature who are hiding out in their offices, appreciate it if you would come to the sanctuary so we can start the service. We already have three members here but we need a few more.

CLERK: I have a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers will be here in a moment, and then we can begin on the...Mr. Clerk, do you want to read in new bills while we are waiting, please?

CLERK: Mr. President, yes, I do. Thank you, new bills. (Read for the first time by title: LB 969-996. See pages 150-57 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have a series of amendments to be printed, Senator Hefner to LR 231, Senator Wesely to LB 720A, LB 678A, Senator Withem to LB 259, LB 259A, and Senator Weihing to LB 505.

Mr. President, I will announce now that there will be a Reference Committee meeting at three o'clock in Room 2101, Reference Committee at three o'clock, 2102. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Ladies and gentlemen, as you will recall, we are on

PRESIDENT: Okay, thank you.

CLERK: Three quick announcements. Reference will meet underneath the south balcony now. Referencing Committee, underneath the south balcony right now.

SPEAKER BARRETT PRESIDING

SPEAKER BARRETT: (Microphone not activated immediately.) ...return to the Legislative Chamber. The Legislature will reconvene and continue our discussion on the adoption of our permanent rules. Please return to the Legislative Chamber. Mr. Clerk, would you read in new bills, please.

CLERK: (Read LB 1031 and LB 1032 by title for the first time. See pages 198-99 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, in addition to those items, I have a new resolution. (Read brief summary of LR 235. See page 199 of the Journal.) That will be laid over.

I have amendments from Speaker Barrett to be printed to LE 409. Mr. President, I also have a Reference Report referring LBs 958-1013, as well as certain gubernatorial appointments received. That's all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 199-201 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Have you a motion, Mr. Clerk, to reconsider action taken last week?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to reconsider the vote on the Wesely amendment to the rules, which I believe the Legislature discussed on Thursday afternoon.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this motion is designed to reconsider the vote that was taken on

PRESIDENT: Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Given the nature of the dinner hour and the like, and I'm sure some people had commitments that are...they are waiting in the wings in their offices, I'd like to have a call of the house, please.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

Okay. The house is under call. Please record your Roll call vote has been requested in reverse presence. order...in regular order, excuse me. So please look up to see if your light is lit, illuminated. Senator Haberman, would you record your presence, please. Thank you. We're looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens and Senator Dierks. Sergeant-at-Arms, how you coming with Senator....Well, there is Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Dierks. There he is. Ladies and gentlemen, the question is the advancement of the bill. Roll call vote has been requested in regular order. Will you please hold down the conversation so the Clerk can hear your response. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 438 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, do you have anything good for the cause?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Urban Affairs, whose Chair is Senator Hartnett, to whom was referred LB 851, instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; LB 957, General File; LB 964, General File; LB 966, General File; LB 968, General File. Health and Human Services Committee, whose Chair is Senator Wesely, reports LB 900 to General File; LB 915, General File; LB 994, General File; LB 997, General File; and LB 1010, General File. Senator Withem has amendments to LB 567 and LB 567A; Senator Smith to LB 769. And I have notice of hearing from Transportation Committee, Government Committee,

SENATOR McFARLAND: This is a bill that was heard in Judiciary. I'll just read briefly the summary or the purpose. It says that LB 579 amends the wrongful death statute settlement notice requirements to allow the judiciary to waive normal notice procedures with the permission of the court. It also allows the court to combine the settlement and distribution hearings. It was supported by the legal counsel for the Judiciary Committee. It was brought to us and also supported by the trial attorneys. There was no one opposed or testifying in a neutral capacity. It did advance from our committee on a 6-0 vote. I would urge you to pass it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Is there discussion? Seeing none, those in favor of the advancement of LB 579 to E & R Initial please vote aye, opposed nay. Shall LB 579 be advanced? That is the question. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of 579.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 579 advances. We'll skip over 834 at the request of the introducer until he arrives. LB 915, Mr. Clerk. Let's move on, Mr. Clerk, to LB 994.

CLERK: Mr. President, 994 was a bill introduced by Senator Schellpeper, Dierks, Coordsen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 4, referred to Health and Human Services Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Schellpeper, please.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members, if you will recall I had a rural health bill last year. We were attempting to set up a separate office last year, a separate commission and that bill was vetoed because of the structure of it. So we came back this year. We made this commission now part of the Rural Health Manpower Commission, so we're not setting up any new commission. All we're doing is just using the present commission that we have in structure right now and it will be the Rural Health Commission part of it. We need this bill in order so that some of the rural health clinics can get some federal money and also to help the rural towns and the rural areas to attract doctors and health clinics. It's a bill that I think has unanimous consent from the rural area because

everyone that testified, they tried to overkill it with loving it so much, so I think it's a bill that is probably wanted in rural Nebraska. So I would just move that we advance 994. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion, Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I would add my voice of support to Senator Schellpeper's bill. I think it addresses what I consider to be one of the most significant areas of critical shortage with rural health, both in recruitment of doctors and health care professionals and also with helping manage some of the financial problems that many of our hospitals are facing in rural areas. And so I introduced a piece of legislation that was very similar to this that was heard by the Health Committee last week. I asked them to delete that portion of the bill that dealt with the rural health care area because of Senator Schellpeper's bill and I'd like to add my voice of support to his work in this area because we're hurting out there in the rural areas and we need some kind of support from this state to address what I see are some very critical problems confronting rural health care, so this may be one vehicle that will help us.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Any closing statement, Senator Schellpeper? Thank you. The question is, shall LB 994 be advanced to E & R? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. While we're waiting, Senator Schellpeper, there is an A bill which I'd like to take up next on 994, if you'd be ready, please. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance 994.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 994 is advanced. To the A bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 994A, Mr. President, offered by Senator Schellpeper appropriates funds to implement the provisions of LB 994.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. The A bill is for \$54,185 in '90-91 and \$56,664 in '91-92. This is quite a bit less than what we had last year, as I said before,

The Banking Committee worked with me and we did put out LB 577 to accomplish that goal. Senator Chambers then came in with LB 1241 which was a bill that he worked with with the administration and it tied in conceptually with what that other bill was. So, originally, what we did in the Banking Committee was we merged, with Senator Chambers' cooperation, LB 577 and LB 1241 so that the whole State of Nebraska would be benefiting from venture capital initiative. And this compromise that was reached in the Banking Committee was one that I was very excited about and appreciated very much Senator Chambers' cooperation. But what's odd is that after we reached this compromise and the committee advanced the bill as amended, then Deb Thomas from the Governor's office came in after the deadline for picking priority bills and told Senator Chambers that the Governor could not tolerate the additional coverage of the whole state, that she wanted only north Omaha to be the focus of the bill. And, of course, I was not happy with that situation and felt that I had not been dealt
